Behind the Name

DALIA RESIDENCE AMWAJ

Dalia Residence, an apartment building located in Amwaj, was named 'Dalia' for simple reasons - the owner, Mr. Ali Al Madhi, was purely inspired by tradition. Dalia, when translated, means 'a small farm or garden' where one would find all types of nature - trees, greenery, animals, birds, water-wells, and open channels formed by mud and stone tiles to control the water flow.

"For as long as I can remember, it has always been understood that the name Dalia also means a grape tree; a grape tree that is supported by wooden frames and joints which are tied to pillars from tree branches. The grape tree would grow to rise on the supporting pillars and joints, and form the perfect shade. All the while the grape would hand down from the joints, and allow farmers to be able to reach them at ease," said Mr. Al Madhi.

The name relates to the building as plants and terraces are a key part of the interior and can be found throughout the entire facility, thus giving justice to its name 'Dalia' or 'the small farm'. Facilities such as a swimming pool, jacuzzi, steam and sauna rooms, kids game area, gym and recreation area, are also available. Dalia is currently being managed by Cozyhome Real Estate.

1. What is Homeopathy?

Homeopathy is a form of natural medicine that was developed by Dr. Samuel Hahnemann more than 200 years ago. Homeopaths view the body as a holistic energetic system and believe that every disease has an underlying energetic cause. Homeopaths are trained to treat the root cause of disease and restore balance to our natural system. One of the differences between Homeopathy and mainstream medicine is that we do not use chemical medicines as all chemicals have side effects which may lead to further complications. What Dr. Hahnemann discovered was that when you dilute a chemical substance over and over again until no trace of the chemical substance remains it still holds the energetic signature of the chemical which is even more potent than a crude dose of the original chemical. Treating a disease with this energetic remedy is therefore 100% safe with no side effects. This is the greatest benefit of homeopathy; only by addressing the cause of the problem can we have a cure. Normally we address the symptoms of the problem thinking that the symptoms are the disease; this suppresses the real disease and often leads to more chronic problems.

2. What is the nature of your job?

I started as a behaviour specialist dealing with children with developmental and language delays, and behaviour disorders like AD/HD and other communication disorders. Now with the Homeopathy my work has expanded and people come to me with all kinds of disease symptoms. As a Homeopath I can treat any disease whether it manifests on a physical, mental/emotional, behavioural or soul/spiritual level.

3. Is it a new concept? Or is it just new to the people of Bahrain?

Homeopathy is not a new concept at all. You will find that a lot of the Indian doctors in Bahrain have had training as homeopaths alongside their training as General Practitioners. There are also some Auverdic centers in Bahrain which have classically trained homeopaths. Traditionally India has a very holistic and natural approach to health and medicine; of course it is also much more affordable than normal medicine. Homeopathy is also very popular in countries like Canada, Holland, France and England where people are more open minded about natural or holistic medicine. I practice a very special form of homeopathy called Sequential Homeopathy where in some cases I will make a timeline of all the shocks that ever happened to a person in their life and treat them in sequence. This is different from Classical Homeopathy and this is definitely new in Bahrain.

4. Do you need a degree to practice it? If so, where did you receive yours?

I have a Practitioner Diploma in Homeopathy and Heilkunst which is an intense five year course which includes one year of clinical practice. I received my training from the Hahnemann Centre in Ottawa, Canada.

5. How is the response for it in Bahrain? Is your client list large?

The behaviour therapy side of the practice is very busy and the Homeopathy has naturally followed on from that. From many years of practice I understood that a child's behaviour is merely a symptom of underlying problems and always felt uncomfortable with chemical medication for young children; that is what motivated me to look for natural and holistic ways of treating children without any side effects. I have combined the behaviour therapy and homeopathy in a lot of my cases and the homeopathy side of the practice is expanding so fast and I am usually fully booked.

6. Do you conduct it from the home?

Most mornings I work in various schools and in the afternoons I see clients at my home in Tala Island.

7. Do you encourage your clients to learn the remedies so that they can apply them in the future? Or do you prefer them to keep coming to you?

If clients are doing the timeline or sequential therapy the process to regain their health can be an in-depth journey of self-discovery and so we have appointments once a month to keep on track. For other more common ailments I prefer that my clients are able to deal with the situations that arise in their home, in the middle of the night or while traveling. Treating yourself and your family for symptoms like colds, coughs, fevers, burns etc. can definitely be learned by anyone, and with a little practice you will definitely see your family become stronger. I want people to take as much responsibility for their own health as they possibly can. It's very empowering. I teach people to become independent with home prescribing, but for more serious issues, chronic problems or timeline treatments, they will need a qualified homeopath to guide them until the issues are resolved.





8. What do you think the most important thing about homeopathy is?

Its greatest benefit is that it is a safe form of medicine that can be used during pregnancy, while breastfeeding and with young children. It has no side effects and does not create further complications and stress for our body to deal with as normal medicine often does. Treating a problem with homeopathy makes one aware that we are more than physical beings and that pain and discomfort are merely our mind's way of drawing attention to an underlying energetic disturbance. We are meant to use our bodies for higher spiritual purposes and homeopathy strengthens our

system and helps create awareness of self and our purpose for being.

9. Why do you think it is not widely known in Bahrain?


We all are in our comfort zones of what we know and live by. It's only when you become unsatisfied with the accepted norm that you look for alternative ways of dealing with problems. Bahraini's are actually very receptive to the concept of homeopathy because the Prophet makes numerous references to energy and the power of intent and dealing with health and disease in a natural way.

10. Can kits be purchased in Bahrain?

I make home kits which can be used for most common ailments.

11. Do you have a favourite motto/saying in life which you would like to share?

I have so many favourite saying like: Be the change you want to see /Every choice has a consequence / The life we live is the lessons we learn and teach.

Safety & Security in Amwaj

Amwaj Security would like to remind residents that fishing and bird catching are strictly prohibited in all areas of Amwaj Islands by both residents and visitors alike. If you would like a drawing of these areas, please contact us. Furthermore, swimming is prohibited except in the areas allocated next to Saraya Al Bahar. As mentioned previously, to help ease the traffic flow of the main gate onto the Islands, the Jurdi Bridge - located on Jood Island - will now be open for access to all construction vehicles and workers. Additionally, we are currently working on plans to ease the traffic flow at the Choueifat junction, and will be keeping you posted on our plans as they develop. Furthermore, in an effort to improve security in Amwaj, Secure Services Limited has been contracted to ensure security for Amwaj residents. Secure Services Limited is currently responsible for all the common areas throughout Amwaj Islands. We acknowledge the residents' concerns regarding several issues and are taking necessary measures with regards to progressing safety issues.
